## The dome of a thousand flowers



D. tapetodes is native to Northeastern Iran through Central Afghanistan and into West Pakistan. Most grow in near desert conditions, often clinging to dry cliffs where they favour overhangs which keep and rain off their cushions.

The smile says it all! John was delighted to have won the George Forrest Memorial Medal with his enormous plant of Dionysia tapetodes. I don't know how he carried it into the show hall without straining his back. There were several contenders for the top prize but John's sunshine dome outshone them all. Fully filling its 36 cm pan it was about half as tall as was wide. It takes a master grower to keep such a plant in perfect condition. Dionysias abhor damp conditions. Their biggest enemy is botrytis.
