



Fritillaria meleagris

We have just returned from the International Conference in Nottingham where we had a lovely time meeting up with many of you. Now we are preparing for a host of visitors who are touring Scotland visiting some gardens so I have little time again this week to say much in words but again I hope the pictures speak for themselves.



Fritillaria imperialis stands stately in the garden – these are seed raised plants and seem to be flowering rather well now they are seven years old. Look carefully and you will see that the stem on the right has a double tier of flowers.



I have not shown many Fritillaries this year as many came when there was so much else to show in the bulb log so I will make a series of small pictures to show some of those that are flowering or have been in the last short while.




Tulip bed
