
Annual Crocus Group Lecture

A search for Crocus chrysanthus-biflorus cultivars

For the past few years we have been collecting Crocus chrysanthus-biflorus cultivars in order to establish the names and identities of the cultivars in cultivation.

So far, we have managed to obtain about 40 named/confirmed cultivars. At times, it has been difficult to establish the identities of the plants we have obtained, and sometimes we have changed our opinion more than once regarding the "correct" name for a plant.

From various lists and old literature we can see that we still lack a number of cultivars. We would be very glad if the Crocus Group could help us with the ones which we do not have.

Below is a list with the names of cultivars, which we have not succeeded in obtaining, but they are, most likely, still to be found. We might be too optimistic but it is worth a try to see if anyone knows of their whereabouts.

We would be glad to receive information on these cultivars, or on other unusual ones, and it would be even better to obtain a few corms.

Growing Crocus from seed is both easy and successful, and the last two lists have offered amongst many other rare species, four species that cannot be obtained and have never been listed commercially or on other seedlists.
