RIGIATES.

Everyone knew, as soon as they laid eyes on it, that the pan of Cyclamen sitting alone at the end of the first bench was a winner! Here nestled the finest pan-full, [YES FULL!], of the smallest Cyclamen species there is. The 10 inch pan filled with palest pink flowers of *Cyclamen alpinum leucanthemum* quite took my breath away. I Can hear 'Berlin' singing the song in brain as I write this report.

Dave Riley has mastered the art of cultivation this tricky wee species. It grows in pine, juniper or cedar woodland at 350 -1500m in an area SW of Antalya. In cultivation esp up north it is usually grown under glass in pots but it is suggested that it could grow in a well drained raised bed.

The species [trochopteranthum] has darker flowers than the form leucanthum, which are of the palest pink with a darker magenta blotch at the base of each petal. The flowers differ from other Cyclamen in that they look like wee propellers. This is because the petals are reflexed by 90 degrees rather than by

180 degrees as is usual in other species of cyclamen.

I find all the spring flowering Cyclamen except C. coum to have their foibles and that they can be very tricky to get into flower. C. alpinum must like life in the Southern Lake District.
