Uhe AGS Encyclopaedia says it is 'not difficult to grow but difficult to grow to a high standard'.

It is related to Primula parryi which comes f m the Rockies of Colorado and Montana it is found in cool damp places. I have seen P. parryi growing among huge boulders at Steamboat Point in the Bighorns and
