## Best Plant in the Show Tecophilaea cyanocrocus shown by Cyril Lafong

Careful driving is needed if you mean to avoid all the cameras along the route. I have travelled with Ian and can attest to his driving skill. Exhibitors and plants arrived safe and well at the Wentworth Leisure Centre on the edge of Hexham to find that many others had descended on the old Roman town with so many plants that this turned out to be the biggest show of the year so far! Well done to all the early rising people whose dedication ensures the success of our shows.
