**LOCATION:** From North: M6 J37 take A684 towards Kendal. After 5 miles turn left on to Park Side Rd (just before 40 mph signs). At T-junction after 0.8 miles turn left onto Lound Rd (A65). School is on left after Shell garage. From the South: M6 J36 take A590/A591 for 6 miles, then A6 to Kendal South. In Kendal, right at first traffic lights, then left at roundabout and immediately right into school grounds.
